Currently led by a representative Board of nine trustees, He Oranga Pounamu has consistently grown and developed into an organisation of high credibility and effectiveness.

The trustees represent Ngāi Tahu, Māori service providers and mātawaka. The management team and staff have successfully supported the development of Māori service provider organisations which now ensures that Māori living in the Ngāi Tahu rohe have access to a wide range of Māori services.

The past year has been a time of change for the organisation as we position ourselves to meet new challenges. In April we farewelled Fiona Pimm as CEO joining together with providers, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu and others to recognise and celebrate her contribution to increasing health and well being for Māori in Te Wai Pounamu.

Transition arrangements have been confirmed as we move to implement our strategic direction. We have drawn on the expertise and knowledge of Trustees and staff to assist us to navigate the changing primary health environment and to ensure that He Oranga Pounamu and Providers are active participants in this process.

To achieve this the Board has made relationships its priority and undertaken a commitment to work closely with Providers and collaborate with the Office of Te Rūnanga to support the aspirations of Ngāi Tahu Whānui and other Māori within our rohe. We have increased our engagement with affiliated providers and are currently scoping a business case to provide a range of shared services that support them to manage more effectively within the current financial environment.

This year the Annual Report reflects fruition and fulfilment from the programme development of the years before, and the efforts that have been put into a number of regional programmes that are now well-established including Whānau-in-Action; SPARC, Kia Piki o Te Ora, CNPAP and mental health and alcohol and other drug work. These activities were marked by either hui in the community or hosted by He Oranga Pounamu.

The provider hui in Hokitika hosted by Rata Te Awhina in October 2008 was based on a workshop approach and turned into a huge success – showing yet again the importance of creating the space for providers, large and small, to come together to share, to compare, and to exchange experiences, understanding, skills and knowledge.

I would like to thank all the staff for their ongoing commitment and untiring energy throughout the year in the face of the demands of the communities, the sector and the internal changes. It is this unstinting commitment that has allowed He Oranga Pounamu to continue to deliver so well and will do so in the year ahead.

Finally, I take this time to acknowledge the Board who have undertaken a results-based approach to measuring our effectiveness and contribution to whānau ora within our communities. We will know that we have been successful when our affiliated network is working collaboratively and whānau are exercising their mana motuhake.

# A Snap Shot of the 2008 – 2009 Activities

Whānau Ora is achieved by our 30 strong “rapidly growing” provider network. Our contribution to whānau ora is support to the network to build capacity and partner with other organisations and agencies to improve outcomes for Māori. We achieve this kaupapa through various mechanisms including Māori Community Consultation, the Whānau-in-Action Programme, data collection and information dissemination, contracting and sub-contracting. This year we were able to pilot two innovative responses to needs of Māori in improved management of whānau finances and a whānau approach to physical activity and nutrition and were involved

**REPORTING ENTITY**

He Oranga Pounamu was established by Deed of Trust dated 1 June 2000.

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Financial Reporting Standards.

**MEASUREMENT BASE**

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance and financial position on a historical cost basis have been adopted. Accrual accounting is used to match expenses and income. Reliance is placed on the fact that the entity is a going concern.

## PARTICULAR ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following particular accounting policies have been used:

### (1) Property, Plant and Equipment

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

### (2) Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided for on a straight line basis which will write down the carrying values of property, plant and equipment to their estimated residual values over their expected useful lives as follows:

Office Furniture and Equipment	5 - 16 years
Plant and Equipment	4 - 16 years
Computer Equipment	4 - 5 years
Leasehold Improvements	3 years

### (3) Goods and Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis except for accounts payable and accounts receivable.

### (4) Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are recorded at expected realisable values.

### (5) Income

Income is recognised as the contractual terms are met. Income received for which the contractual obligations have not been met is carried forward as income in advance.

### (6) Taxation

No taxation is payable as the trust has tax exempt charitable status.

### (7) Differential Reporting

The trust is a qualifying entity for differential reporting as it does not have public accountability and is not large as defined in the framework. The trust has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions.

## CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on bases consistent with those used in the previous year.
